Sports Center Charred



Investigators have not ruled out any causes as crews work to clean up the mess

Sunday evening, a two-alarm blaze broke out at NNU's Johnson Sports Center. The official emergency call came in at approximately 5:54 p.m. and fire trucks arrived on the scene shortly thereafter. By that time, many students and community members had gathered to witness the fire. Firefighters worked for several hours to contain the blaze.

Investigators are still looking into the official cause of the fire, but arson has not been ruled out.

At a press conference held Monday by university president Richard Hagood and Nampa City Fire Chief Doug Strosnider, Hagood stated that the fire

began in the port beneath the fitness center at the rear of the facility. Several large rolls of turf, supplies for the current conversion of the building's pool to an indoor soccer field, were being stored there. Strosnider said that it was "an extremely hot fire" with temperatures reaching upwards of two thousand degrees Fahrenheit, melting steel doors. Strosnider said that wind was definitely a factor in the rapid spread of the flames.

The fire itself was contained in a relatively small area at the back of the facility, but severe smoke and water damage permeated virtually the entire facility. The building was fully insured and the administration has no doubts that all repairs will be covered. "We are adapting to the challenge that is before us" said Hagood.

There is extensive damage to the interior of the facility. The entire hallway outside the suites on the second floor has been stripped of its drywall and all of the ceiling panels had to be removed. The staircase beyond the suites sustained damage as well and is labeled as "unstable". The fire entered the building around this area and worked its









way up the stairs, which eventually lead to the activation of the sprinkler system.

The sprinkler heads have been credited with keeping the fire contained. However, once water hit the fire, super hot black steam was created which billowed throughout the building, condensing onto walls, covering them with thick black stains. Over fifty sprinkler heads went off in the building to combat flames.

When cleanup started, there was over an inch of standing water in the field house and around the front desk. Hagood said that the cleanup crews had to remove some seventy thousand gallons of water leftover from the sprinklers. An estimate on the cost of the damage has yet to be determined.

The crew working on the restoration is working around the clock and will not stop until the job is finished said Hagood. The first goal is to get the classrooms up and running so that classes can resume; classes that were meeting in the JSC are currently using facilities at College Church of the Nazarene.

Hagood also said that the community has

quickly rushed in to aid NNU during the cleanup of the JSC. Skyview High School has offered their facilities for NNU sports teams to practice and compete; the Ladies Basketball team will host their last two home games at Skyview. The Men's Basketball team has their last games of the regular season off campus this week. Tippy Burke, a point guard for the men's team, said "I am just glad we got to play our last home game on campus". The Nampa Recreation Center has also offered NNU athletes free passes to work out until the JSC is declared usable.

When asked if the current situation was going to slow down any other building projects on campus, Hagood said that a separate contractor was being used for the new Science building and that there will be no conflict with construction.

Ralph Palmen, presented with an honorary Doctor of Laws last year by NNU, was on campus Sep. 28 for the NNU Foundation Board of Directors meeting, and to raise awareness about the Foundation. Despite the fact that he is not an NNU graduate, Palmen has dedicated a lot of time and money to help further the university's mission.

A native of Clarkston, Wash., Palmen only attended NNU for one year. He said "I had a lot of ambition, but I wasn't very channeled." After his brief stint at NNU he moved on to begin working in the employment industry, a job he described as a perfect fit. Palmen then moved into the real estate industry, but continued to pursue his love of working as a recruiter. Eventually he started his own company, Express Personnel Service, which has expanded to include almost 600 franchises.

Currently, Palmen works as a speaker, a vocation he says he felt he was called to. He is also a successful author of several self-help books, and president of Pinnacle Forum, an organization that connects Christians who are in places of influence in order to help America to get back in touch with its spiritual values.

The university is very important to Palmen, who sees NNU as a place where students can learn the skills they need to become successful in life, as well as get firm spiritual support in their developing years.

Palmen has been involved with the Foundation Board of Directors since its inception in 1988, and served a term as its chairman. The NNU Foundation is dedicated to helping NNU grow as an institution. Since student's tuition only pays about 60 percent of the school's total costs, the Foundation serves as an important tool for the university.

The Foundation has many visible accomplishments on campus, including the Johnson Sports Center, the Brandt Center, the Helstrom Business Center, the security fence, the key-card system, the Ford/Culver parking lot, and many air conditioners in the dorms. Dr Walden Hughes to receive Professional Achievement Award in Friday's chapel

After a careful selection process, Dr. Walden Hughes has been chosen to receive the 2007 Professional Achievement Award for his success as a teacher and composer. He and four other NNU alumni will be presented with awards for their loyalty and service to their alma mater this weekend during the homecoming festivities.

The Professional Achievement Award will be given to Dr. Hughes in recognition of his 30 year career as a piano teacher here at NNU. One of his former students was recently named Music Educator of the Year. Hughes himself received the Master Teacher Certificate from the Music Teachers National Association in 1995, an honor given annually to about three musicians in the United States for "outstanding contribution to the music teaching profession," according to the Piano Technicians Guild website.



This award also serves as recognition of Dr. Hughes' accomplishments as a composer. His 88 piano ensemble compositions and arrangements have been performed in 51 different countries to date. He has been contracted to write musical pieces for performing arts schools and has published 30 articles and various book and CD reviews in a number of professional music journals, including *Clavier*, *Piano Quarterly* and *American Music Teacher*.

"I am certainly humbled and was very surprised when I received the letter indicating the award was coming my way," Dr. Hughes says. "There are many deserving alumni of NNU and somehow they must narrow the award down to a single recipient each year. I will accept the award and proudly display the evidence of it in my office, but I know there are many other deserving alums."

The other recipients of alumni awards are Hugh and Evelyn Friberg, Darrell





Marks, and Joseph Lanham.

Hugh and Evelyn Friberg received the Alumnus of the Year award in recognition of their 19 years of teaching at the Bible College in Sitkei, Swaziland. Friberg acted as the registrar and dean for the college and his wife performed as the librarian during their time in Swaziland.

Darrell Marks received the Distinguished Service Award for his 35 years of service in the physics department of NNU. Dr. Marks retired in 1998 with emeriti status but has continued to serve NNU part-time in University Advancement. He has worked with scholarships since his retirement and has initiated or improved 50 scholarships that total out to over \$1 million in worth.

Joseph (Jody) Lanham received the Leon Doane Young Alumnus award. The Leon Doane is given to a person who has graduated from NNU in the

Man who walked with King still advocating nonviolent civil rights education

The courage to stand up for yourself and your fellow man in any instance is hard to find. Most of us in this day and age are seldom afforded the opportunity to do so. Reverend James Lawson was given the opportunity in the 1950s and 60s and he took advantage of it.

Lawson was a key figure in the civil rights movement, known for his experience in the art of non-violent resistance. His work began in Nashville Tenn. in the late 1950s by organizing a set of workshops aimed at desegregating the city through non-violent techniques used by Gandhi, specifically the sit in. Lawson trained his students to prepare themselves for all sorts of violence, physical and verbal. Ultimately, the non-violent tactics worked. Nashville began to desegregate, something that the rest of the segregated US could not ignore.

Lawson was invited to speak at Northwest Nazarene University during the "Beloved Community Week", an annual event that was created several years ago to educate students about civil rights by bringing key speakers and advocates to campus.

When asked to comment on whether or not he was prepared for the national attention his efforts received, Lawson said "strategy should be locally devised and if you've done a good job, it's gonna have national and international implications."

It was Martin Luther King Jr. who urged Lawson to drop what he was doing and come work in the south to utilize his experience with non-violent action in December of 1957, a year after Lawson had returned from mission work in India. Working in the south and within the movement brought Lawson into close contact with King. "I found him a warm, loving, brother, friend [and] colleague. I learned in my association

with him that he loved to play. He loved to play football, basketball, swim and he was a good athlete...you bounce against him you feel muscle."

Lawson said about King that "I took him for granted for so much, you know, and I regret some of the ways I took him for granted. I took him for granted simply because that's the way it was, we were colleagues and friends."

Today Rev. Lawson lives in Nashville, Tennessee with his wife and continues to speak out around the country about nonviolence and its uses in the world against oppression.

"I have never had doubts about the efficacy of non-violence," said Lawson. "Gandhi said that non-violence was the best-kept secret of human history, because what was written about is the wars. There is a fairly large literature of non-violent episodes, and now, this literature is growing because we had the civil rights movement from a nonviolent perspective, then you had major non-violent movements in the Philippians, in Poland, in Chile, in East Germany, in Romania ... There have been all kinds of campaigns in the 20 century and those campaigns are increasingly being studied."
