SNU President Keith Newman will be our speaker at the December ASP luncheon.

Dr. Newman was elected as the fifteenth president of Southern Nazarene University in 2017. With 17 years of pastoral ministry in the



Church of the Nazarene and 15 years of service as an administrator in Christian higher education, Dr. Newman seems a good fit for SNU as it seeks to fulfill its stated mission of "making Christlike disciples through higher education."

Before entering the ministry, Keith served nine years on the Houston Police Department. During his law enforcement career, he served in the radio patrol, juvenile and homicide divisions.

Keith met his wife Carolyn at the Houston Police Department where both sergeants were assigned to the Homicide Division. Their second date was to a middle school youth group event where Keith was serving as a volunteer youth pastor. Married for 34 years, they have two children: Andy and Alana who both live in Texas. Keith and Carolyn have two granddaughters, Avery and Baylin. They call Keith "Pop," a title which has become his favorite.

A graduate of SNU's Master of Ministry program, Keith did his undergraduate studies at Houston Baptist University where he majored in history and Christianity. His Doctor of Education with a concentration in leadership is from Spalding University (Louisville, KY). His dissertation was an examination of the leadership qualities and characteristics of J.B. Chapman, Nazarene leader in the first half of the twentieth century.

Keith loves to read stories, hear stories, and tell stories, and he believes God is in the middle of all our stories. Spending time with students each week is at the top of his list of favorite moments.

Just a few weeks later, she met Paul Milford Sodowsky, and they were married September 2, 1938. They have two children: Linda and Paula.



Kathleen served with Paul for 20 years as Pastor and wife in churches of the Nazarene in Texas, Kansas, and Missouri. She enjoyed working with children and making home and hospital calls as part of their ministry. Later, Paul took a position in Pensions and Benefits at Nazarene Headquarters in Kansas City, Missouri, and Kathleen as a secretary in the Department of World Missions. Kathleen then worked as a secretary in the office of General Superintendent for seven years. She attended Avila College in Kansas City where she obtained her B.A. degree. Her last 10 years in Kansas City were spent as private secretary to the Dean of Nazarene Theological Seminary.

Paul and Kathleen moved in the fall of 1982 to Oklahoma City to be closer to their daughter Paula. They soon traveled to Brazil to spend time with their daughter Linda and her family who were missionaries there.

Kathleen loved people and was very involved with many groups. She was a member of Bethany First Church of the Nazarene, the Academy of Senior Professionals, and the Association of Retired Ministers and Missionaries. She spent as much time as possible with her grandchildren, and later her great-grandchildren.

She is survived by her daughter, Paula Anderson and husband Don; seven grandchildren, Toby Stamps and wife Ruby, Todd Stamps and wife Leslie, Tiffany Stamps and husband Stephen, Traci Ayers and husband Rob, Matt Anderson and wife Joanna, and Chris Anderson and wife Lana, and 20 great-grandchildren.






