



The 2003 *Darda* is dedicated to **William M. Greathouse** beloved professor, former general superintendent in the Church of the Nazarene, former president of Nazarene Theological Seminary, former president of Trevecca Nazarene University, pastor, and friend.

We want to honor **Dr. Greathouse** for what he has done for us, for Trevecca, for the denomination, and most importantly, for Christ, and through these words we want to show students what God can do through persons who are committed to and in love with him.

The heart of our Lord's teachings was delivered from a hillside. Matthew writes in chapter five, verse one, of his gospel, "Now when he saw the crowds, he went up on a mountainside. . . and he began teaching them."

By verse fourteen, he is suggesting that his followers are to "let their light shine. . . like a city on a hill."

Since the turn of the century, when the first "pastor's class for Christain workers" convened, our people have visualized themselves "sitting at the feet of Jesus" attending to His words.

In 1935 Trevecca actually moved to a hillside overlooking Nashville. And since that time, the biblical figure has been embraced in a variety of ways, most explicitly in a phrase from our school song: "On a hill stands old Trevecca. . ."

I congratulate the editors and staff of the 2003 *Darda* for reminding us of the theme in this volume. I join them in calling us, once again, to remember who we are as the poeple of God under Christ's authority.

Matthew concludes his account of "The Sermon On The Mount" by noting that "the crowds were amazed. . . because he taught as one who had authority" (7:28-29).

As this theme is worked out in the volume, I trust that those of us whose pictures appear on these pages and whose activities are recorded here will resolve to live lives in accordance with the teachings of the Master heard "on the hill."

No college experience would be complete without one simple little utensil, the hot pot. It serves so many purposes. Any college student can tell how to make ramen noodles at least





YOUTH IN MISSION

The Youth in Mission passion statement is "...a God-centered ministry, prayerfully seeking to build the kingdom of God by making global Christians. We feel called to pursue the broken, neglected and unreached areas of the world with the love of Jesus Christ. This work we aim to do through the equipping of students for incarnational ministry, sending them to care for the poor, comfort the dying, and evangelize the lost. To this end we strive personally to walk with God and to invite others to do so." The purpose is to evangelize and YIM participants do that by going on eight-week summer trips to various places all over the world.

Those who go on the mission trips are college students from all over the United States. Some of the places that these students venture off to are the following: Kenya/Tanzania, Madagascar, South Africa, Uganda, three regions of

Australia, New Zealand, Saipan, Thailand, India, the Balkan region, Croatia, Germany, Italy, Slovenia, Baltimore, Long Beach, Los Angeles, New York, Philadelphia, Brazil, Costa Rica and two Creative Access countries (which simply means that Christian missionaries are not allowed to be there). The work that the teams do there varies from friendship evangelism to work and witness to Vacation Bible Schools. The impact that the students leave is one of compassion and true Christian love.

Trevecca students have always had their hands and hearts in this program. Every year the school sends twenty students to serve through Youth in Mission. An appropriate response to the Trevecca motto "To be rather than to seem" is to serve the Lord through missions. Thankfully, our students have the opportunity to work and witness.

King's Kids

Working with the J.C. Napier Community, one of Nashville's most impoverished neighborhoods, King's Kids is a Trevecca ministry functioning through Trevecca Community Church of the Nazarene.

Children of the Napier community are picked up by bus every Tuesday evening and stay in the care of the King's Kids staff, Trevecca students, for several hours. Usually, between thirty and fifty children attend this ministry weekly. During King's







THE WAR ON TERRORISM

Over the course of the year, the world's attention focused on a chain of tumultuous terrorist events. In Afghanistan, the Taliban regime fell from power as U.S. troops crippled the al-Qaeda network and cleared caves in search of Osama bin Laden. World-wide, civilians and military personnel fell victim to terrorist bombs and acts of hatred. On the home front, "bioterrorism" became a common term after it was revealed that Iraqi leader Saddam Hussein was producing biological weapons. Hussein's defiance of United Nation's imposed sanctions prompted the United States to

seek world support of military action against Iraq. Members of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization wrestled over conflicting opinions on the issue, while North Korean leader Kim Jong Il threatened to deploy nuclear weapons if Iraq was attacked. As tensions rose among political leaders, the world watched and waited to see what the next chapter in "The War on Terrorism" would bring.
